

Submission guidelines, 13th international conference on Researching Work and Learning (RWL13)

Conference theme: Researching work and learning in times of change.

Abstracts are invited for contribution in one of the following formats:

- 1. Paper presentations: abstract 600-800 words
- 2. Symposiums three presenters planning to focus on the same theme: rationale 200-300 words + abstracts of 300-400 words
- 3. Poster presentations: abstract 300-400 words

Abstracts should be submitted no later than October 1, 2023.

Abstracts should be anonymized and submitted as Word or PDF document, no later than **22.10.2023**. Please follow the format below. You will be informed regarding acceptance by **15.01.2024**. The deadline for submitting full papers (approximately 8–10 pages, including references) is **15.05.2024**. All abstracts should be submitted in English.

Please indicate in the email title whether your abstract is for a paper, symposium or poster.

Please include author(s) and affiliation(s) (including contact information to the corresponding author) in the email.

Abstracts should include the following:

- 1. Title
- 2. Presentation format (see above)
- 3. Research Framing (e.g., general description, aim, theoretical framework)
- 4. Methods / Methodology
- 5. (Expected) Results / Conclusions
- 6. Relevance to research field of work and learning
- 7. References

Symposium, rationale 200-300 words & abstracts 300-400 words

The organizer of the symposium should submit a symposium proposal with a plan for the symposium that includes all the following elements in a single document:

- 1. Rationale (200-300 words) containing:
 - a. The title of the symposium
 - b. The names of the contributors
 - c. A Chairperson and a Discussant, who can offer a critique of the symposium, need to be named on the proposal.
- 2. Abstracts of each paper included in the symposium (300-400 words)

The organizer of the symposium is responsible for communicating with the contributors and the conference organizer.
