Intended learning outcomes

After completion of the course, students will be able to:

- use basic literary terminology
- write an academic essay using a literary methodology
- through the use of appropriate literary methodologies and terminology
analyse literary texts and frame these in relation to relevant social issues
and themes in the English-speaking world.

Course content

In the course students discuss modern literature primarily from Great Britain and
the USA, which in various ways reflects social, cultural or political issues. The
course introduces terminology and analytical methods pertinent to the field of
literary studies.

Teaching and working methods

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars. Homework and independent
studies are a necessary complement to the course.

Language of instruction: English

Examination

The course is examined through an individually written exam, active participation in seminars and written take-home assignments. Detailed information about the way the course is examined can be found in the study guide for the course.

If the LiU coordinator for students with disabilities has granted a student the right to an adapted examination for a written examination in an examination hall, the student has the right to it.
